



Jurisdiction

According to College of Alberta Psychologists, Practice Guideline (2019), "Registered Psychologists from Alberta offering services to clients outside the province must be registered with the regulatory body in the location in which the client is receiving services and where the psychologist is providing services (if required by the distant jurisdiction). Psychological services delivered must follow all relevant legislation, regulations, and standards in the jurisdiction where both the client and the psychologist are located. Should there be disparity, the psychologist will act in accordance with the higher standard."
